




# What should Universities be?

## Foreword

Students and their academic teachers form the core of every University, but corporatised University businesses run by managers now largely disregard this with detrimental effects on academic life and the ability to undertake high quality research and teaching. At the same time, Australia and other modern countries increasingly need universities run by scholarly criteria, yielding graduates and research outcomes for society.

USAP seeks to clarify what universities should be and to identify the changes required to improve public perception, industry connections, and Government policy that affect Universities.

We hope to develop consensus on recommendations and future plans for all stakeholders, by merging ideas from invited speakers, panel discussions, and audience members. One outcome might be the formation of an Australia-wide association of Professors that Government could consult.
